Everything written in Swedish or Norwegian between 1947 and 1978 has been translated into English; the customs transit document and the obituaries remain in the language of their time. Tip: print on heavier paper and cut out along the dashed line. The papers of the forties and fifties can be aged with cold tea, the printouts from 1977 stay fresh.

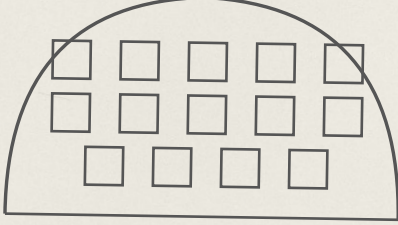

Kiruna, February 1953

On 4 February 1953, a tunnel was discovered in the mine near Kiruna that is not on any plan. The tunnel lies less than a hundred metres from the silent cavity that was found in 1947. The Collegium sent two Thaumaturges. The escort numbered fourteen men, including myself.

The tunnel is warm. Fresh crystals sit on the walls like ice. In the tunnel we found dogs, altered, with crystals in their fur. The dogs attacked when we touched the crystals. They recovered from gunshots, only fire stopped them. The bullets passed through the thing in the wall without damage.

Something stood in the wall. It was already awake. It did not speak as long as no one spoke. One of the Thaumaturges drew a circle, stayed inside it, answered. The thing turned to him. The Door closed with him on the other side.

Three of fourteen men survived. Own losses: eleven men, one Thaumaturge of the Collegium. None were recovered.

The mask of grey crystal was found in the tunnel.

Nordlicht. The clocks stand at ten past ten. In Wales it was ten past ten as well.

I have read the search party's report. Haugen writes like a soldier. He counts the backs, the cups, the crystals. He does not write what he heard. I do not ask him about it.

The eleven read the seventh circle. Holloway read it in 1959. She went through the Door. This time I went. That is not the same.

I start a new folder: the Black File Nordlicht. I put the comparison of the two times inside. It stays in Stockholm. Not in the Wall. In the steel cabinet, in the second compartment, with Notebook Zero, the page from 1871 and Sander's letter of 1957. I lock both locks.

For twenty years I searched for murderers. I never searched for the dead. Now I search for the dead. I do not know if I want to find them.

I do not write down what I heard. Not on this night. Not in this book.

Nordlicht, 20 February 1977.

The clocks stand at 22:10. All the clocks. The wall clock in the canteen. The alarm clocks in the dormitories. The stopwatch in the workshop. The time clock on the generator. The clock in the radio set. All show 22:10. None ticks.

The crystals are grey. 212 of them. Catalogued, packed, in their places. The little lead boxes are cold.

The cups are still warm. Ten are half full. One is not. I have not touched the cups. I have had them measured. The temperature is the same. 31 degrees. After six days.

Addendum, 23 February: 412 pages of readings. The last sentence of the report reads: 'The readings are consistent with an event for which there is no measurement.'

I went into the canteen alone. I stood in front of the wall clock. Seven minutes. I took my own watch off my wrist and laid it on the table. I left it there. It showed 22:10.

We measured something that cannot exist, and it measured us.
